Ramblings from the Reverend

Come check out the Library in the Adult Sunday School Room! Our church library has recently been inventoried and reorganized. This wall of shelves contains an amazing variety and number (over 650!) of books. These books have been acquired or donated to the library over the history of our church, with the oldest book (a leather-bound Bible compendium) from 1895.

We have something for everyone. There are Bibles in different translations along with commentaries and Bible study guides. We have books of devotions and prayer with different themes (parenting, running). Reference books share the shelf with fun Bible Trivia books. Personal stories of inspiration and Christian journeys sit next to guides to Christian living and family relationships. Fictional renderings of familiar Bible stories help bring these stories to life.

Some thinning of the library was done during the inventory process. These books (duplicate copies, books without religious content, etc.) are free to anyone who would like to adopt them. Check out the boxes of books on the hearth in the Fellowship Hall and take one or more home with you.

Women’s Bible Study Monday Mornings

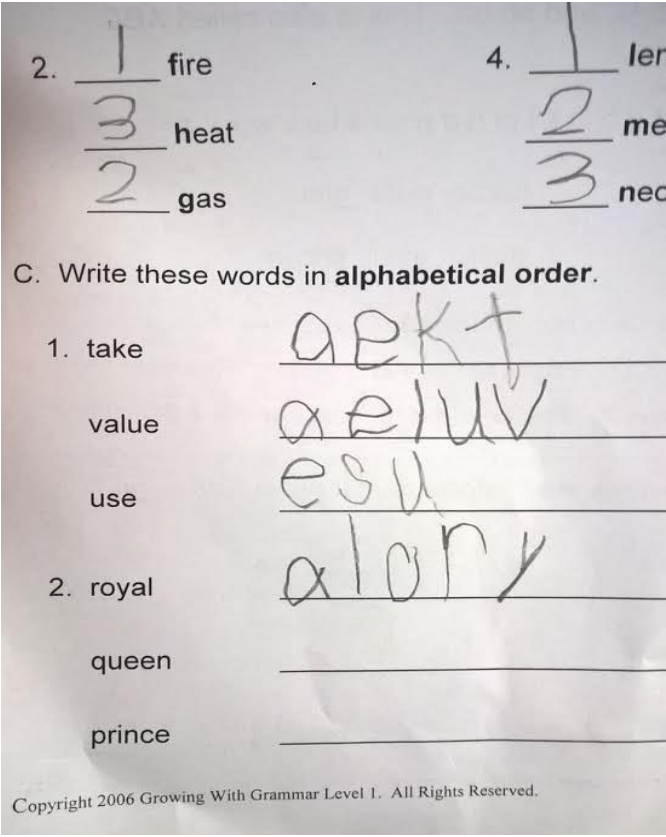

Is It So Wrong?

This is a wonderful piece of work by a young student (not a local student, as far as I know). Instead of putting the three words in each group in alphabetical order on the lines provided, our young friend has written each word itself in alphabetical order. Given the way the worksheet is laid out, this makes even more sense. The student clearly understands the general concept of alphabetical order but perhaps not its purpose. While it clearly takes knowledge and insight to rearrange the letters of each word into alphabetical order, there isn't much utility in doing it. At some point, the student will gain further knowledge and probably not alphabetize lists of words in this manner again.

The student who did this work is intelligent, clever, and diligent—doing it this way seems much harder than alphabetizing the list as intended. While the answers are not strictly correct based on what the worksheet was going for, it is hard to fault the student as totally errant. Nevertheless, we would still correct the student.

I think this offers us insight as we are wrapping up our sermon series, *How Jesus Transforms the Ten Commandments*. I think we have discovered Jesus transforms the Ten Commandments by making them much more of a heart issue (what is going on inside) and not simply a matter of conduct other people can see and judge. Jesus also transforms the commandments by giving us much more grace and mercy in upholding the commandments than we can expect.

When we sin and get it wrong, we might have done so unwittingly or out of good motivation and yet we are wrong. The grace of Jesus covers the penalty for our sin, but that does not mean we shouldn't be corrected. We shouldn't continue in sin because we know grace will cover us or because we messed up in a cute way that others will get a chuckle out of. God loves us but God will still correct us because he wants us to be refined into greater Christ-likeness so that we will fulfill our God-ordained destiny of glorifying the Triune God eternally here and in the world to come. Acknowledge where you are in your life and faith—celebrate where God has led you—but don't remain in that spot, for God has even better plans in store.

Amazon Smile

Over the past months, you may have seen announcements on the screen or in the bulletin about Amazon Smile. Here's some more information about it.

What is Amazon Smile?

It is a program where Amazon donates 0.5% of your eligible purchases to a charity that you select. Otherwise, it works precisely like the regular Amazon website and looks the same. Basically, it is a way to give money to a charity by shopping at Amazon with no extra cost to you.

How do I use Amazon Smile?

If you are a current Amazon user, go to smile.amazon.com, you do not need a new account. You may or may not have to sign back in. It will ask you to select a charity and you can search for Waterville Federated Church. Amazon Smile will remember the charity you selected and you may change it at any time.

How does the church benefit?

We receive 0.5% of the eligible purchases you make on Amazon Smile. That might not sound like a lot, but if everyone does it, it adds up. We have already set up our free account with Amazon Smile and have been receiving contributions for several months.
