Mary and Joanne shared information about their process and timelines. Using the information the Board and Pastor Seth shared, Mary and Joanne have a good idea of our congregational identity and hopes for the future. The United Methodists appoint pastors to start on July 1 and hopefully we will have someone by that time.
